History of Visiting Scholar in Residence Lecture

The visiting scholar in residence program is designed to introduce newer and promising scholars in corporate and business law to the Delaware bench and bar, so that the bench and bar can benefit from their scholarly insights and so that they can enrich their scholarship with feedback from Delaware's internationally renowned legal community. The program has created strong bonds between that community and future leaders in the law school community.

Verity Winship is a Professor at the University of Illinois College of Law. Her research focuses on corporate and securities litigation and disputes that cross legal systems. Her articles have appeared in such journals as the *Vanderbilt Law Review*, the *Delaware Journal of Corporate Law*, and the *Stanford Journal of Complex Litigation*. Professor Winship is an honors graduate of Harvard College and Harvard Law School, where she served as an executive editor of the *Harvard Law Review*. Upon graduation, she clerked for Judge Lewis A. Kaplan, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, and for Judge Marjorie O. Rendell, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit. She practiced law with WilmerHale in New York City in the area of securities enforcement and litigation.

Her topic, **Shareholder Litigation by Contract**, will examine current issues in the use of litigation bylaws and charter provisions to limit shareholder litigation.
